The Centre for children and adolescents with Learning Disorders - Grand-Duchess Maria Teresa (CDA) focusses attention on the transfer of knowledge. In addition to coaching and advanced training, great efforts have been made to create and to develop the resource library *Troisième Lieu*.

IT IS BASED ON FOUR PILLARS:

- **The library**, which comprises a variety of specialised literature;
- **The Toolbox**, where readers can find didactic material and educational programmes;
- **The "test-library"**, where you can find numerous standardised tests, only accessible to qualified personnel;
- **Personal counselling** about a specific predefined topic.

WHY TROISIÈME LIEU?

The third place - in contrary to the first, one's home, and the second, the workplace - is the place where everyone can meet up and chat on an equal basis, without any social hierarchy.

We wanted to create such a place for educational personnel inside the CDA where they can meet and exchange experiences. A place where peers can support each other.

PRACTICAL ASPECTS

- To view and borrow the material displayed at the *Troisième Lieu*, each visitor needs to register first. The registration is free.
- To check the inventory and borrow material, the reader has to present themselves at the resource library's front desk. They will be required to provide a relevant certificate or diploma to get access to the standardised tests, as the "test-library" is only open to qualified personnel. Access to the standardised tests is only possible upon request.
- You can search for documents and materials online using the search engine a-z.lu.
- Reservations for documents can also be made via mail: troisiemelieu@cc-cda.lu.
- Readers have to collect reserved documents directly from the CDA. Collection from the branch offices can be requested by email.
- The reader can borrow up to six items for a maximum of four weeks (an extension is not possible).
- Borrowing of scientific magazines and items marked with a red dot is not permitted.
- The documents available in the *Troisième Lieu* can be copied in line with Copyright legislation. A photocopier is therefore available for your use. For environmental and economical reasons we ask you to keep copying to a minimum. Documents in the "test-library" cannot be copied.
- Readers can also use free wi-fi when on the premises.
